Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time – 30th January 2022

This Sunday's Scripture

St Paul says that at the centre of our church there must be self-sacrificing love that is always patient and kind ... and.... delights in the truth. Jesus was rejected by the chosen people, as was Jeremiah for speaking God's truth. With Pope Francis we are renewing our church. In order to do this, Christian unselfish love must be at the centre of our community in order to prevent self-centred destructive attitudes from taking hold.

Keeping Faith

The Worldwide Synod: 'Synod' means walking together (of the parish community). Pope Francis is asking all the laity to take a much fuller part in the work and life of the church. Rightly understood, this will give each of us a deeper sense of involvement and therefore of purpose and satisfaction in being a Catholic. He asks us to think how we do this in our parishes. He wants us to be a supportive family of faith (communion); so that we have the trust to open our spiritual life to development and are motivated to take a fuller part in parish life (Participation); and with this new confidence to be able to witness confidently to our faith in the secular world around us (Mission).

The Synod: Communion, Participation, Mission. Pope Francis is asking us all to complete a survey.

There are three ways of replying:

- **As a parish**, giving our joint responses: This is the preferred method. We will meet Sunday 20th February, at St Charles at about 10.30am after Mass, and at Christ the King at 2.00pm. You will be asked to choose one of the three topics above.
- **Individually on paper.** Take a pack supplied and mail it to Fr. James Burns the diocesan coordinator at **Synod Responses, St Mary of Furness, Victoria Road, Brogden Park, Ulverston, LA12 0BY.**

- If you are unable to attend the meeting(s) and wish to have a pack mailed to you, please contact the parish office.
- **OnLine** and directly to the coordinator via link on parish website. (This is on the home page, just scroll down to ‘Synod Survey’ and click on the ‘Tell Us’ button to participate in the survey).
- Please show this newsletter to any ‘resting’ or non-practising Catholics, or any other interested persons. Their views are respected and valued.

The Presentation of the Lord: (Wednesday) Our Lord is presented to his faithful people represented by the aged Simeon and Anna. He is recognised with joy as the light of the gentiles and the glory of His people Israel. We enter the church with candles lit to welcome Jesus with joy. We are Christ’s faithful people meeting the Lord. The candles also represent His light shining out to the world carried by us. We are to be Beacons of the Good News. The Presentation is celebrated at Grange this year on Wednesday.

The Star of Bethlehem: The star over the crib will be taken down after the Presentation Mass. Jesus, our guiding light, is not an external thing like a star in the sky. Jesus is within us, guiding us through scripture church teaching and our consciences.

This week’s parish intercession is: “May all nations unite and pursue the things that make for peace”. *John 14: 27*
